Feedback on Potential Boundaries for Medicare Locals & Local Hospital Networks

Nicola Roxon has announced the public release of the final version of Carla Cranny's report on Primary Health Care Organisations boundaries, commissioned by AGPN. The full report is now available for download from the YourHealth website www.yourhealth.gov.au/internet/yourhealth/publishing.nsf/Content/AGPNSubmission

The Commonwealth is now beginning community consultations on these draft boundaries; at the same time the boundaries of Local Hospital Networks are currently being negotiated between the Commonwealth, States and Territories. States and Territories will also consult with stake holders LHN boundaries. Following this initial consultation phase (closing 30th September) the Commonwealth, States and Territories will produce a combined set of government-endorsed LHN and PHCO boundaries for further consultation. The Commonwealth and States and Territories have committed to finalising and agreeing the Medicare Local Boundaries and the Local Hospital Network Boundaries by the end of 2010.

Mental Health Hotline Opens

All Victorians now have access to a 24 hour Government Mental Health Advice Line. One in five Victorians are affected by mental illness each year and many more will feel its impact through family, friends and colleagues.

The service is for people who can't put a name to their experience but know that something's not right and don't know where to get help and information. For example, it could help a father who is concerned his daughter might have an eating disorder, or the daughter who doesn't know how to handle her dad's forgetful and erratic behaviour.

People who have a mental health issue or concern for their family or friends can call the line for fast access to reliable information and referrals from trained mental health professionals.

Veteran Best Practice: Working Well with Older Veterans, War Widows & DVA

Free Seminars - **Ararat 24th August**

The Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) warmly invites representatives of your organisation to attend an Aged Veteran Best Practice seminar. These popular seminars are conducted nationally for aged care providers and developed with industry input. The aim is to increase provider knowledge and awareness of older members of the veteran community, their health entitlements and services available. The veteran community makes up a large proportion of aged care service recipients, and has been assigned Special Needs Status under the Aged Care Act.

The response to the seminars has been very positive, with creative approaches to veteran issues resulting from attendance. In many cases attendees have provided a valuable internal resource for their agency, with an increased knowledge of veteran issues and DVA service. An important outcome has also been increased awareness and appropriate usage of DVA contacts and resources. Participants will have the opportunity to discuss how to optimise support for veterans, and meet DVA representatives.

The seminar is suitable for community and residential aged care providers, discharge planners, allied health professionals, community nurses, practice and health managers and social workers.

The program will include: introducing older veterans & their health issues; working with the Veterans' Affairs Network; allied health services; rehabilitation appliances program; respite services; convalescent care; veterans' special needs status; pharmaceutical entitlements of veterans; commemoration and grants; working with ex-service organisations; veterans' home care; community nursing; repatriation transport scheme; HomeFront falls prevention program.
