This plan outlines initiatives to strengthen partnerships between providers of Home and Community Care (HACC) services in the Wimmera area of the Grampians Region.

The purpose of the partnerships is to improve access and choice for Aboriginal people living in the area by maintaining links between the Goolum Goolum Aboriginal Co-operative and the partnering agencies which include all HACC Assessment Services (HAS) in the area and West Wimmera Health Service.

This plan is based on the understanding that Aboriginal people have the opportunity to receive HACC services from the Co-op or HAS provider and, where required and preferred, both services.

All agencies have agreed to implement this plan wherever possible within the constraints of existing resources. All partners have nominated a key contact person, marked on the right with an asterisk - #.

The Department of Health, as sponsor of this Partnership Project, will support and monitor the activities arising from this plan and encourage links with Active Service Model and Diversity Planning activities.
