**Cross cultural training** Title<sup>.</sup> During this project HAS agencies have expressed a desire to undertake training in cultural awareness. There appears to be three types of training required: 1. Local stories – information about history and significance of the local area 2. General background awareness - broad information regarding cultural sensitivity 3. HACC specific issues – how we can work together in a culturally sensitive way. Budja Budja is able to provide training in small groups of eight people. In addition, there is a plan for an e-learning tool to be developed for the region.
