AGREEMENT

Assessment and referral pathways:

Living At Home Assessment Agencies & Budja Budja Aboriginal Co-operative

PREAMBLE:

This agreement was developed during the Grampians Region HACC Partnership Project (June 2012) to improve communication and working arrangements between HAS agencies and the Budja Budja Aboriginal Co-operative.

It has been agreed to plan for the situation where an Aboriginal person seeks to receive HACC services from both Budja Budja and a HAS provider. This may be due to:

- Dersonal preference of the Aboriginal person we support choice
- The availability of the right mix of services it is not possible for Budja Budja to provide all HACC services
- Discharge from hospital
- The problems of distance it may be necessary to deliver shared care where distance from Halls Gap is a problem.

This agreement is to confirm a commitment that all agencies follow a clear but simple process to ensure that the choices of an Aboriginal person are recognised and, where consent is provided, both Budja Budja and the HAS agency can collaborate through assessment, goal setting and service delivery.

AGREEMENT:

It is agreed that:

- Either Budja Budja or the HAS provider will contact each other when the Aboriginal person provides consent
- Arrangements for assessment will be done together: as a joint assessment or with Budja Budja in an advocacy role
- Arrangements for proof of Aboriginality are not required by the HAS agencies, however, Budja Budja policies stipulate that proof of Aboriginality is required to access Budja Budja HACC services. NB: Budja Budja provides a General Practitioner service to both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people.
- Contact between agencies will be maintained so that advice on culturally appropriate service provision can be provided at any time, with Budja Budja acting as an information resource
- Both agencies will collaborate to make links with other programs or agencies for example special interest groups such as a Men's Shed or arts group
- Arrangements for managing any fees or cost such as transport will be discussed to achieve the most responsive outcome for the Aboriginal person
- □ All progress and review activities will be done jointly, including arrangements to withdraw services.

PARTIES:
